## A HOLY WEEK RETREAT

### 2-8 April 2012 Holy Week and Easter Retreat

A creative holy week retreat with Daniel Muñoz and Cecile Huijbregts based on Henri Nouwen’s book “Can you drink the cup?”.

It includes:

- ▶ Meditations on the passion of Christ.
- ▶ Modeling a personal ceramic chalice. *No modeling experience necessary.*
- ▶ “Seeing Salvation” guided visits to the Lanjarón and Padul holy week processions (in the Granada area).
- ▶ Free time for personal prayer and reflection, and to relax and enjoy the natural surroundings.
- ▶ Accommodation and full board in losOlivos (it does not include wine or alcoholic beverages, which can be purchased from the guest bar).

### PROGRAMME

**Monday:** Guests arrive (from 4 pm). Introduction to the course: *The Question*.

**Tuesday:** Meditations on the themes “Holding the Cup of Sorrow” and “Holding the Cup of Joy” .  
Pottery Workshops: modelling the cup.

**Wednesday:** Meditation on the theme “Lifting the Cup of Blessing” .  
Pottery Workshop: painting the cup.  
“Seeing Salvation”: evening guided visit to the Lanjarón holy week processions.

**Thursday:** Meditations on the themes “Lifting the Cup of Life” and “Drinking from the Bottom”.

Special Maundy Thursday celebration (Iona Community liturgy).

**Friday:** Meditations on John's Passion story and “Walking the journey” (Stations of the Cross in the *Garden of Olives* quiet garten).  
“Seeing Salvation”: evening guided visit to the Padul holy week processions.

**Saturday:** Sabbath Day (Day of Rest). Free day to allow guests personal time for prayer/reflection, or time to explore the area (optional visit to the Al'hambra Palace may be arranged at an extra course). The day will end with a special Pascha evening celebration (Service of Light).

**Sunday:** Easter Celebration (Eucharist) and distribution of chalices. The retreat ends after lunch.

**Daniel Muñoz** is an Anglican priest and theologian, and chaplain to losOlivos. He has led art and spirituality projects in parish churches in the Oxford Diocese (UK), where he served as a priest for 9 years, and founded of the Marlow Art and Spirituality Network (Bucks, UK).
